Rejoice greatly, O Daughter of Zion! Shout, Daughter of Jerusalem! See, your king comes to you, righteous and having salvation, gentle and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey.—Zechariah 9:9

As soon as the people heard the sound of the trumpet, the people shouted a great shout, and the wall fell down flat, so that the people went up into the city, every man straight before him, and they captured the city. - Joshua 6:16b ,20

When I blow the trumpet, I and all who are with me, then blow the trumpets also on every side of all the camp and shout, 'For the Lord and for Gideon.' ” – Judges 7:18

Let the godly shout (sing) for joy to the Lord; it is fitting for the pure to praise him. - Psalm 33:1

Clap your hands, all you nations; shout to God with cries of joy. —Psalm 47:1
